One of the major ideas behind the party was to get the neighbourhood opinion on how we can take the parish centre forward. The centre needs an eco-revamp to move it towards being carbon neutral. We also want to know how the space can better serve the neighbourhood.

Christians believe that we are called to be stewards of God's creation and to take care of the world as He would. Here, at St. Matthew's, we are on a journey towards making our building a part of that vision. If you didn't get to the Garden Party but

#### **The Parish Centre**

#### **Our Refresh / Carbon Reduction / Eco Project**

#### We have 3 Challenges:

- 1. The Parish Centre was built in the mid-90s. After 30 years of hard use, the building is not energy efficient and is looking tired.
- 2. Crucially, the building is heated by our old, gas-fired boiler. It needs a reliable, greener heat source, moving us closer to net zero.
- 3. The needs of the church and the wider community have changed since the 1990s. It is time to consider what needs to be done to modernize and refresh the Parish Centre for another 30 years.



#### The Parish Centre (cont.)

#### We are proposing 3 Steps (we are about to start stage 1 this autumn)

- 1. In Stage 1 an architect will investigate opportunities to refresh and reconfigure the building to make it ready for another 30 years. Engineers will investigate upgrades to insulation, heating, lighting and ventilation, and the potential for a new, greener heating system. A heat pump or 'hybrid' heat pump with a small gas boiler system will be among the options.
- 2. In Stage 2 we will consider the technical advice and decide what the changes should be. Then we will need to raise funds to pay for the main project design, changes to the building and installation of the new heating.
- 3. In Stage 3 we will go out to tender and appoint contractors to do the work.

#### And so we have 3 Questions, and ways to record your ideas

- 1. What do you like about the Parish Centre now?
- 2. What do you think we could do to make the Parish Centre carbon footprint lower?
- 3. How can we make the Parish Centre facilities better for you?
