That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way." May that Almighty hand guide and uphold us all.



Parish Centre 'Refresh'

The Parish Centre is a familiar sight on Marlborough Road. It was built in the mid-90s and, after 30 years of hard use, it is time for an update. The building is heated by a gas-fired boiler. It needs a reliable, greener heat source, moving us closer to net zero.

An architect is investigating opportunities to refresh and reconfigure the building. Engineers are investigating upgrades to insulation, heating, lighting and ventilation, and the potential for a new, greener heating system.

Later in 2025 we will consider the technical advice and decide what the changes should be.
